Microsoft Quarterly Review

It has been a particularly busy quarter for **Microsoft** with major version releases of many of their major product lines, but it hasn't all been plain sailing.

The rollout of their **Windows 10** October 2018 Update (version 1809) was paused as some users had reported that files had gone missing after updating. This has had a knock-on effect on other product releases such as **Windows Server 2019** as there is shared code involved. After investigation and amendment by **Microsoft** the rollout is now under way again.

During the same period **Microsoft** has released **Office 2019**, **SharePoint Server 2019** and **Exchange Server 2019** is now in general availability.

Although **Microsoft's** long-term productivity goal is **Office 365** in the Cloud, they have recognised that for many customers the need to keep some or all their applications on-premise. **Office 2019** will ensure this is possible. New features include enhancements to the inking feature, improved data analysis capabilities in **Excel**, expanded **PowerPoint** animation features and better security. One downside is that **Office 2019** will not be supported on **Windows** versions older than **Windows 10**, which rules out the still popular **Windows 7**.

The **SharePoint Server 2019** release has been designed to dovetail with **Office 2019** and includes **Next-Gen Sync Client** support, **Flow/PowerApps** integration and other innovations filtered down from **SharePoint Online**.

Cyber Security – 2019 Outlook

2018 was the year that people became more aware of **Cyber** and **Data Security** for both good and bad reasons.



Firstly, the good... Since the 25th May 2018 the **General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)** has been in force across the EU. The goal of this new legislation is to help align existing data protection protocols whilst

increasing the levels of protection for individuals.

This has been good for businesses too, making them more aware of the consumer data that they hold and ensuring its safe keeping.

Then the bad.... If 2017 was the year of **Ransomware**, then 2018 has been the year of the 'breach' with many attackers infiltrating networks and stealing or randomly publishing personal data.

In September social media giants **Facebook** disclosed that they had suffered a security breach and up to 90 million user accounts were exposed. This is after they were fined £500,000 for 'serious breaches of data security law' earlier in the year with the **Cambridge Analytica** scandal.

British Airways suffered a sophisticated attack in August and it affected 380,000 transactions where both personal and financial information was stolen, and the **Information Commissioners Office** are currently investigating.
